Wellness visits basically provide your doctor with a status update on your overall health. They can help guide you to make choices that promote better health, and they can catch health problems early. Examples of a wellness visit include mammogram, colonoscopy, vision exam, dental cleaning, and/or yearly wellness physical. If you have had your wellness exam and have one of the following - Accident Insurance, Cancer Insurance, Critical Illness, and/or Hospital Confinement, make sure to file your wellness claim for your annual reimbursement for 2022. Each one of these plans have a wellness reimbursement each calendar year, with just one wellness exam visit. See below for reimbursement benefits. 
