The data indicates that the process for teaching, demonstrating, and evaluating the radiographic competencies are effective and meet the required standards as established by CODA. The DA Instructor will continue to work on enhancing teaching and demonstration techniques (power point, Camtasia, guest presenters, etc.) to even further improve competency results. The 2014-2015 class utilized digital radiography in their course (DA 19102 Dental Radiography II) completing preclinical competencies on DEXTR and a live person. Results showed that 100% of the students met the digital
