LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Being a new college president has its challenges, but more than anything it has its rewards. In my first few months on the job, I have been amazed at the momentum with which we operate. It makes for an exciting time when so many initiatives are at play, and I can see our faculty and staff going above and beyond in their pursuits to engage students and help produce real, tangible, positive outcomes. We are in the business of transforming learning, lives and community, and this is why the rewards make the challenges so worth tackling.

In the last few months we have partnered with other community colleges and the state in creating and implementing the Arkansas Steelmaking Bootcamp. This initiative is an accelerated, two-week training program offered for free to area citizens to prepare them for entry into the steel industry. It is our goal to assist the local steel industry in providing basic steel-related training for more than the 1,000 anticipated new hires in the near future. Our first cohort finished with an 87% placement rate.

We have seen the effective and efficiency rating of our Adult Education Program increase from 36% to 59% from the 2021-2022 year to the 2022-2023 year. Currently that program is holding a 67% retention rate which is 12% higher than last year.

We are excited to have students back on campus following the COVID pandemic. We have increased our student activities on campus where at least one event is planned each month to give students the opportunity to meet new people and participate in fun and engaging activities.

The ANC Foundation has worked hard to increase revenues to assist our students and hosted events for the public that help foster friendships and grow new ones in addition to raising needed funds. It is so gratifying to work with such wonderful people committed to our College, the students, and the community.

The momentum we have going now is a motivator for the future. As we head toward our fiftieth anniversary, I have exciting plans for our College including a facelift for the first facility built on the current ANC campus — the John P. Sullins Administration Building. It is my desire to raise the funds necessary to remodel this facility to once again make it the sleek, architectural show-piece it once was. Our students, staff and community deserve nothing less. As we embark on this endeavor, I hope that each of you will consider giving toward this project and being a part of polishing the diamond that is Arkansas Northeastern College.

On behalf of Arkansas Northeastern College, I wish you all a happy and safe holiday season and wonderful new year.

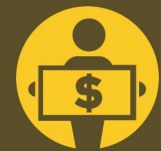

A \$1.2 million grant from the Arkansas Office of Skills Development (OSD) to the Arkansas Northeastern College helped create the Arkansas Steelmaking Bootcamp. The boot camp, a job skills initiative is projected to train over 1,000 Arkansans in its first year, is designed to meet the need for skilled workers in the growing industry.

Over the past few years, Mississippi County in Northeast Arkansas has become a significant steelmaking hub. Companies like Big River Steel / U. S. Steel, Nucor-Yamato Steel, Nucor Steel Arkansas, Highbar Steel, Tenaris, Majestic Steel USA, Lexicon, Atlas Tube, Arkansas Steel Processing, Ratner Steel, SMS Milcraft, Primetals, and others are either expanding current operations or constructing new plants. The area boasts a variety of transportation options and a motivated workforce that are attractive to manufacturers.

“The mission of OSD is to strategically invest in all levels of the Arkansas workforce. This grant represents the state’s support of the expansion of the steel industry in Northeast Arkansas and the need for a strong workforce in the area. Creating a condensed training benefits the companies who have chosen to invest here and individuals looking for an in-demand, high-wage career.” said Cody Waits, OSD Director.

The boot camp provides entry-level knowledge for those entering the steelmaking industry. Graduates of the two-week, 80 hour boot camp receive an OSHA-10 General Industry Certification, First Aid/CPR Certification, and a Certificate of Program Completion. Each boot camp can accommodate 25 participants in a cycle. The first-year ANC will offer 20 cohorts and partner with other colleges like Arkansas State University Mid-South, Arkansas State University Newport, Black River Technical College, and East Arkansas Community College to offer another 22.

Arkansas Northeastern College President Dr. Christopher Heigle is excited about this new initiative and proud of the partnerships forged to meet the needs of his service area. “This tremendous opportunity afforded us through the Arkansas Department of Commerce’s Office of Skills Development, has made it possible for Arkansas Northeastern College to greatly expand what we do to help meet the needs of our steel industry and its anticipated growth over the next few years,” said Heigle, adding, “We have wonderful relationships with our sister institutions, and their support in joining in this effort will allow us all to apply our skills and abilities to offer the Steelmaking Bootcamp throughout all of Northeast Arkansas. This initiative will provide our steel industry with a far-greater pool of prepared job applicants, illustrating a truly regional approach to workforce and economic development. This is the most exciting project I’ve ever worked on, and I am honored to be at the helm of such an innovative and workforce-focused institution.”

“Like any other industry, steelmaking has a specific skill set. While much of those skills are taught on the job, knowledge of safety procedures, hydraulics and pneumatics, technical math, blueprint reading, and basic safety with heavy equipment creates a strong foundation for those seeking a career in steelmaking.” According to Waits, “Our investment covers training fees, materials, and salaries, so students can take advantage of the boot camp at no cost.”

Arkansas Northeastern College has been providing training for the steel industry for more than 25 years, including offering a two-year degree in Steel Industry Technology. The sharing of this experience and expertise coupled with the financial support of the Office of Skills Development, gives the Steelmaking Bootcamp less hurdles to overcome in bringing qualified workers to area industry. “Great things happen when people work together and put positive energy into the greater good. The Steelmaking Bootcamp initiative is an example of just that. This is a win-win for everyone, but mostly for the communities we serve. I am proud to be a part of something so big that it will benefit so many. Our industry partners are very important to the viability of our communities, and we will always work to provide them the training they need,” said Heigle.

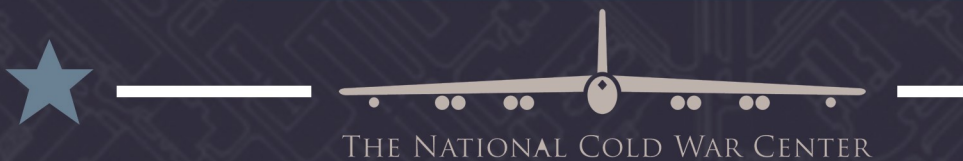


★ COMMUNITY EDUCATION HOSTS TOUR AT COLD WAR CENTER ★

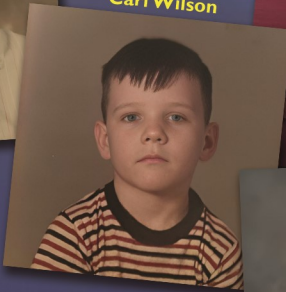

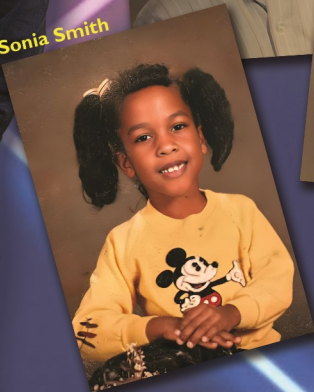

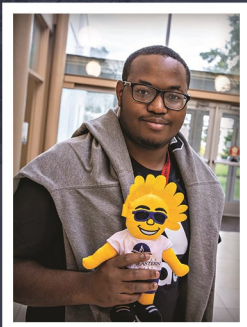
