Position Description: Position is a 10-month position to begin immediately and reports to the Dean of Occupational Programs with potential evening assignments. Duties include teaching all subjects in the welding curriculum leading to a certificate or Associate of Applied Science Degree in welding in both classroom and laboratory settings to secondary and postsecondary students, maintaining lab and equipment, maintaining student records, etc. Additional duties include academic advising, service on college committees, and office hours. Other responsibilities include curriculum development, participation and promotion of program at career fairs, and other recruitment activities.

Qualifications: An Associate in Applied Science Degree in welding or a graduate of a certified trade school is preferred; a Bachelor's degree is a plus. Minimum requirements are a high school diploma or equivalent plus completion of a one-year postsecondary training course in welding, plus two years' teaching or work experience in welding. Prior community college or trade/technical school teaching experience is desired. Possession of a valid Arkansas Teaching License in the appropriate field is a plus. Applicant must be a Certified Welding Inspector (CWI) or Certified Welding Educator (CWE) or be willing to achieve certification within an agreed upon time. Applicant should be thoroughly familiar with all aspects of welding with knowledge and skills in SMAW, MIG, Flux Core MIG, and TIG and must have knowledge of Gas and Plasma Cutting with abilities in Metal Fabrication. Applicant must have experience with SMAW, GTAW, GMAW, FCAW welding processes, and the ability to teach in other technical areas will be an asset to the applicant. The candidate must have the ability to relate to a diverse student population with a wide range of academic skills. The candidate must have knowledge of electronic communications, basic computer concepts, program and course development, industry collaboration and partnerships, and certified welding inspector requirements.

Salary: Salary is determined by education and experience as defined on the faculty placement schedule. A generous fringe benefits package is included.

Application Deadline: Review of applications will begin immediately and will continue until the position is filled. Interviews may occur throughout the application period.
